3. (8 points) Solve Laplace's equation on the square $D = \{(x, y) \mid 0 \leq x \leq \pi, 0 \leq y \leq \pi\}$ with the boundary conditions

$$u(x, 0) = 0, \quad u(x, \pi) = \sin^3(x), \quad u(0, y) = 0, \quad u(\pi, y) = 0.$$

5. (4 points) Exercise 5.1.3 (a) and (b)
6. (8 points) The equation $\frac{\partial^2 u}{\partial t^2} + \beta \frac{\partial u}{\partial t} = c^2 \frac{\partial^2 u}{\partial x^2}$ represents a damped version of the wave equation. Consider this PDE with boundary conditions $u(t, 0) = u(t, 1) = 0$ on the interval $0 \leq x \leq 1$. Assume that $0 < \beta < 2c\pi$, so the damping coefficient is small relative to the wave speed.
 - (a) Find all separable solutions to this PDE that satisfy the boundary conditions.
 - (b) Find the series solution to this boundary value problem. If the initial conditions are $u(0, x) = f(x)$ and $\frac{\partial u}{\partial t}(0, x) = g(x)$, state integral formulas for the coefficients of your series solution.
 - (c) Discuss the long-term behavior of your solution.
